We may look at this parable in more than one way. If we are of the "tree-hugger's" point of view, then we would say that the fig tree is a living organism and it should live until it dies of natural causes. Coming from a farming background, I can testify a farmer usually has the stance that if "it doesn't grow, it's got to go." We may look at it as the tree being the nation of Israel. Israel did not fulfill all that God wanted and it would be cut off from His blessings. The barren fig tree could also be likened to a living soul. We are all fruitless unless we are united with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, through faith. For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23) and Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." (John 14:6)

While our team was on location, we held devotions in the morning and evening each day, along with debriefings. We listened as we learned of a Christian family that heard a knocking at their door, to which the father answered the door to find ISIS soldiers demanding if the inhabitants of this household were followers of Jesus. The father not wishing to deny his Lord, stated that they were. An ISIS soldier killed the gentleman quickly. The members of the household were then ceremonially and systematically killed, except for one young adult female. After she was beaten, she was released to tell others of the "power" of ISIS.

One of our drivers and interpreter was run out of his own home as his father literally shot at

him trying to kill him, once finding out his son was a follower of Jesus Christ. You must realize it was the son who was taking care of his handicapped father: providing a roof over his head, food on the table, and clothes on his back. The father told the rest of the family his son chose to follow Jesus and now the son was open game for anyone in the extended family to kill and avenge the family's honor. The son lost his job, too.

My anger mounted as I heard these and other stories of persecution. I asked God, "Why?" Usually I am not a violent man, but I found myself thinking, "God, just cut them down, like the fig trees in the garden that are not bearing good fruit! Why should they be taking up space on the face of the earth? I do not understand."

The Holy Spirit came silently, gently, truthfully, and very real to me, stating, "Jesus, God the Son, came to save <u>all</u> souls." I was humbled. God Almighty showed His power and might before we left our mission field for we saw our driver and his father reconciled. (For a father, and head of the family, to admit that he was wrong, and his son was right, in this part of the world, and in this faith-mind set, was an act of God. Truly out of the ordinary.) We saw three women in our little church clinic come to the saving knowledge of Jesus as their Savior...all on the same day! (Realize, this made life dangerous for them, as their husbands did not presently know Jesus as their personal Savior.)

How amazing that our Savior, the one who tends our garden, knows when to cultivate, when to prune and when to clear the garden. Thank God, He still teaches me. Praise God, He still saves souls. What a wonderful Savior we serve.
