~A note from the Executive Director~

## **ONLY TRUST AND OBEY**

Each year I read through the Bible. This year I am using The Message. Frequently, I identify a question or thought to think about as I read every day. The thought I am focused on this year is, "Mine is not to question why; mine is but to do and die." The idea for this thought is adapted from "The Charge of the Light Brigade" by Alfred Lord Tennyson, and is another way to express that all God wants from me is to only trust and obey.

This thought reminds me daily that I am a soldier in a spiritual battle as suggested by Ephesians 6:12(NIV), "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." Paul then describes the armor of God that I need to wear daily to stand strong as a soldier bravely facing the enemy.

I am also reminded that I am serving as God's Ambassador as stated in II Corinthians 5:20a (NIV): "we are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us." As an ambassador, I am not representing myself, but I am representing Jesus and it is his message I need to communicate in how I live and what I say.

I have spent much of my Christian life asking God why. However, the more I come to know God the more I realize the truth of Isaiah 55:8-9 (NIV), "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Instead of asking why I merely need to trust and obey.

Peterson in the introduction to Leviticus in *The Message* says, "One of the stubbornly enduring habits of the human race is to insist on domesticating God. We are determined to tame him ... we figure out ways to harness God to our projects. We try to reduce God to a size that conveniently fits our plans and ambitions and tastes." I think my why questioning was to make God into my image and try to persuade him to support my plan, instead of seeing him as he is and joining him in his plan. As I

I appreciate Fred's reflection on his commitment to focus on trusting and obeying God this year. We as healthcare workers have found ourselves on the frontline dealing with the pandemic these past 12 months. Most of us have not been able to work from home but have been in the pharmacy and the hospital providing the care that our patients have trusted us to faithfully provide. We have all been affected in many ways, some with the illness, some having lost dear ones, some comforting those in their last hour on this earth, and all of us having to trust and obey our political and healthcare leaders that have put forth requirements about social distancing and the use of personal protective equipment. Many have struggled trusting and obeying some of the mandates imposed by those in authority. But I want to encourage all of us to be faithful in the care of those entrusted to us and to be diligent to trust and obey those in authority over us. Proverbs reminds us to not lean on our own understanding, but to acknowledge Him in all of our ways. When we look to Him, he will make our paths straight.

The CPFI board of directors once again had to make a tough decision about whether to have our annual meeting and student retreat in person, online or a hybrid of both. We sought God's wisdom and were led to plan a virtual meeting. Because of the challenging times and the isolation I think it is more important than ever for us to embrace the technology that will allow us to gather and unite our hearts in prayer and fellowship. Even if you no longer need to keep up your

continue to reflect on my thought for the year, I hope to grow closer to God, trust him completely, and represent him well as a soldier in the Lord's army and as an ambassador from His kingdom. This is not easy. It requires daily, if not moment by moment effort. My life verse is Romans 12:1-2 and it talks about a daily commitment. The Message paraphrases these verses, "So here's what I want you to do. God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, goingto-work, and walking around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you."

I hope you will join me this year as a soldier in the Lord's army or an ambassador serving faithfully without questioning until in the words of that old hymn,

"When the trumpet of the Lord shall sound, and time shall be no more, And the morning breaks eternal bright and fair; When the saved of earth shall gather over on the other shore, And the roll is called up yonder, I'll be there." Join me in standing firm until the time "When our role is called up yonder."

# **Short Term Foreign Mission Opportunities**

CPFI partners with the Christian Medical and Dental Association, the Fellowship of Christian Nurses and the Fellowship of Christian Physician Assistants to send out short term medical teams through Global Health Outreach. The primary care teams are usually one or two weeks, and our goal is to have two pharmacists on each team. Below is a list of upcoming trips.
