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Original Licensure and Licensure by Examination



As a component of initial licensure, or licensure by examination, 45 boards of pharmacy require passing a law exam administered by NABP. Currently, most states require the MPJE, but as of April 1, 2026, several states have begun transitioning to the UMPJE. Find out which states accept the **UMPJE as an early adopter**.

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Definition of Standard of Care




- > The **level of care and service** that a **reasonably competent and skilled** health professional, with a **similar background** and in a **similar setting**, would have provided under **similar circumstances**.
- > It is a **benchmark** used to measure the **quality and appropriateness of the care** provided by healthcare practitioners.

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Standard of Care Implementation




- > Iowa was the 3rd state to implement a standard of care framework, following Idaho and Alaska.
- > Iowa Pharmacy Association is focused on creating educational resources for members and collaborating with the Board of Pharmacy to implement this legislation.

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Iowa Code Chapter 155A* (Pharmacy Practice Act) (HF 555)




- > Allowed for Therapeutic substitution (e.g. changing atorvastatin 40mg to rosuvastatin 20mg)**
- > Added "pharmacist" to the definition of "Practitioner" found in Sec. 2 Section 155A.3, subsection 39, Code 2024, **effective July 1, 2024. This definition includes prescriptive authority.**
- > Removed 10-mile tele-pharmacy mileage restriction from the nearest community pharmacy
- > Overall reduction in bright line language

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Governor's Executive Order #10*




The timeline shows the following steps:

- September 2019: IPA House of Delegates adopts policy to create a task force
- September 2020 to October 2020: Task Force meets four times to draft a new Practice Act
- July 2021 to October 2021: Task Force conducts five open hearings
- September 2022: IPA House of Delegates adopts policies consistent with Standard of Care
- January 2023: Governor Reynolds issues Executive Order #10
- February 2023: Pharmacy Practice Act legislation (HF 555) introduced
- April 2024: HF 555 passes both chambers
- April 2024: Governor Reynolds signs HF 555 to become law
- July 2024: Law goes into effect
- Fall 2024: Iowa Board of Pharmacy completes review and rewrite of IAC 657

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Iowa Administrative Code



- **Notice of Rule Changes:** On May 8, 2025, the Iowa Board of Pharmacy voted to adopt changes to its administrative rules. **This action will rescind all current rules under 657 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) and replace them with new Chapters 550 through 557 under 481 IAC.** These changes are part of the Board's compliance with Governor Kim Reynolds' Executive Order 10, issued in January 2023.
- The adopted rules took effect on or around July 16, 2025.

- Is the act expressly prohibited in statute or rules?
- Is the act consistent with their education, training, and experience?
- Is the act within the accepted standard of care that would be provided in a similar setting by a reasonable and prudent licensee or registrant with similar education, training, and experience?

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❖ What happens if a compliance officer doesn't agree with something we do, even if a large group of reasonably competent pharmacists agree?


❖ The Board of Pharmacy will identify experts and ultimately make the decision. They will use resources from experts in the field, standards across the country and the state of Iowa written by professional associations and other healthcare organizations to determine if something was appropriate. It will not be down to the decision of one person. There is still a process to determine if something was within the standard of care.

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Neumann's Pharmacy, L.L.C. v. DEA

United States Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit
February 13, 2026

- DEA revoked a LA pharmacy's registration for 3 "red flags"
 1. Drug cocktail, Therapeutic duplication, Self-pay
- DEA claimed that the RP violated DEA regulations; RP contended that the DEA misinterpreted its own regulations.
- RP consulted prescribers and documented.
- Court said that the DEA finding a violation "without first determining that any Rx was invalid when issued" is a misapplication.
- Corresponding responsibility applies to RP ONLY if 3 elements are met:
 1. RP fills
 2. An invalid prescription
 3. KNOWINGLY
- Ruling places liability on RPs only when an order for a controlled substance is invalid. It may be the precedent, if followed, that relieves RPs from legal action due to "red flags."
