I joined CPFI in 1984, shortly after the organization was founded. There have been very few years since that I have not held an elected or appointed office in CPFI. In March I celebrated my 76th birthday so as I complete this term I am aware that I do not have many more years to continue to serve. God deals with individuals, and I am encouraged that he continues to meet individual pharmacists' needs through CPFI. I have been blessed by my work with CPFI. When I hear testimonies of others receiving blessings too, I am comfortable that CPFI is where God want us to be now.

My other confirmation of this is that although we continue to struggle financially, our needs continue to be met. We have been able to live within our means and still have money in the bank. I see this also as God's blessing on CPFI.
