


2017 Annual Board Meeting Membership Committee Report

Comments:

- Membership trends are indicated on the graph and spreadsheet attached. Professional membership is down about 8% and Student Membership is down 22% over 2016 totals thru May. Since May 2012 our professional membership has fluctuated between 389 and 455 (average is 425) so we are near our average this year. Student Membership has fluctuated between 672 and 428 (average of 550) so we are down significantly this year from our average. Total membership compared with May 2016 is 939/2017 vs 999/2016- so we have some work to do, especially in the student membership area, but also overall!
- Since our last Board meeting CPFI hosted a breakfast at APhA in San Francisco. Our speaker was CPFI member Bill Kehoe and we had around 50 in attendance, including some non-members. The program and venue worked very well and, due to significant negotiating by Nena we had a nice continental breakfast and stayed pretty well within the budget- attendees paid \$25.00/person!
- There are a lot of numbers on the graph and spreadsheet indicating both paid up members by date along with analysis of delinquent members each year delineated by length of time delinquents for each year.
