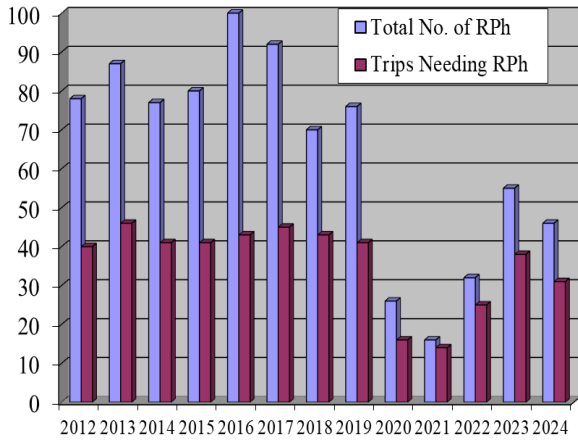
Praise the Lord short-term medical mission brigades through Global Health Outreach (GHO) continue. This year, 31 GHO teams that needed a pharmacist have been completed. Six went without a pharmacist, 16 had one pharmacist and 9 had 2 or more pharmacists/students. There are 25 teams that need pharmacists going out in the first 8 months of 2025. Nine trips already have one pharmacist signed and 3 each have 2, but 13 do not have anyone yet. There will be about another 10 trips added towards the end of the year, but they have not been finalized yet. The 46 pharmacy team members that went this year included 9 student pharmacists. Thanks to the thoughtful CPFI members who have participated.

The Mission Committee is pleased CPFI gives out up to \$1000 scholarships to CPFI members who apply to help defray the costs of participation in a GHO short-term mission brigade.

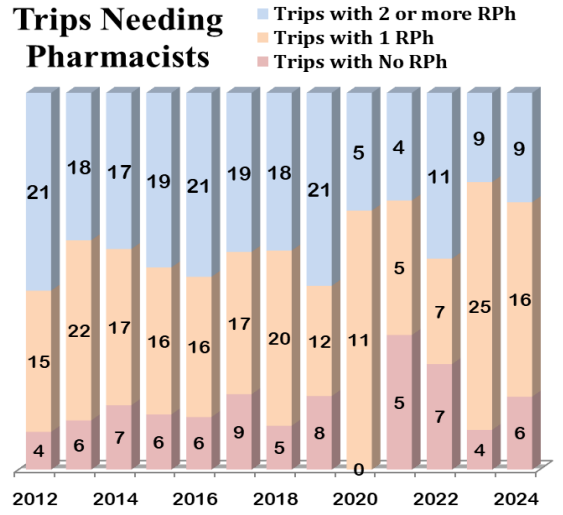
