Welcome to our 2022 Winter CPFI National Student Council Newsletter!


We are praying for all of you to have a wonderful new year. In the most beautiful times and the most difficult times of this coming year, please know that God is with you through everything.


We are so excited to see what our chapters are doing all across the country. Lastly, we will share some advice from a CPFI leader, and a testimony from a student!

What advice would you give to our members as they go into school and their careers?

"Life is very busy for you all right now, and it is not going to slow down. It can be very easy to get stressed out and brought down by the difficulties that life brings us and forget that we do not have to carry that weight alone. I encourage everyone to make it a habit to talk to God and maintain relationships with others who you can share your faith with. When you are faced with disappointments -- you don't perform as well on an exam as you hoped, you don't get the residency or job that you wanted -- always remind yourself that God has a purpose for your life that you may not yet be able to see. Bring your burdens to Him, lean on others for support, and find peace in knowing that God is in control."
