Our success was made possible through the generous money and item donations from students and faculty throughout the College and by the volunteers willing to plan out and purchase the remaining necessary items. We also applied for (and received) a \$750 grant from the UK Student Government to help cover the expenses of this service project. The item selection and packing had a healthhygiene theme, so every box contained a toothbrush, a tube of toothpaste, a large bar of soap, two washcloths, and a box of band-aids in addition to a box of crayons, a coloring book, toys, and socks. We learned that students across the college were more willing to participate when they had the option to donate specific health-hygiene related items.
