'Finding Hope in a Changing Health Care System'

The 2013 CPFI Annual Conference & National Student Retreat was held in Flat Rock, North Carolina last week. Pharmacists, student pharmacists, and their family members from 23 states, Canada, and the Congo gathered at the Bonclarken Conference Center, a Christian conference center, located at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Gracious southern hospitality, beautiful surroundings, excellent food, and comfortable contemporary guest rooms are just a few reasons why Bonclarken has become a favorite location for many who attended last week.

The theme for the conference this year was 'Finding Hope in a Changing Health Care System'. Dr. David Stevens, CEO of the Christian Medical and Dental Association, opened the conference with an engaging perspective on the Christian response to massive changes in healthcare. Twelve hours of continuing education were offered throughout the three-day event, which included three separate panel discussions on topics such as:

Practicing your calling as a Christian pharmacist, Achieving success in your pharmacy career, and The pharmacist's role on a short-term medical mission. Dr. Ron Herman and Dr. Fred Eckel served as moderators for the panel discussions. CPFI members Jennifer Sands and Robert (Bob) Watt blessed the group with faith inspiring devotional messages on Friday and Saturday morning, and lively praise and worship music was led by William Shelton on piano and Manasseh Heeralall on guitar.



The traditional Friday night event was hosted at the conference site this year, rather than at an outside location, and included a country barbecue along with a variety of outdoor activities for all ages. A 700 foot dual zip line was the most popular activity and attracted folks of all ages, including six year old Caison Dial, son of CPFI member Brian and Theresa Dial from Laurinburg, North Carolina.

CPFI member Bob Stillwell of Hendersonville, NC led conference attendees on a tour of The Cove: The Billy Graham Training Center in Asheville, NC during free time on Saturday afternoon. The Saturday night awards banquet provided an opportunity to honor several individuals for their service to CPFI and this year the

Warren Weaver Award was presented to Clarence Gissendanner. Clarence has been a member of CPFI since 1997 and has served CPFI in various leadership roles. Clarence is retired from the United States Public Health Service, however, he continues to volunteer his time as a Red Cross volunteer pharmacist at the U.S. Medical Center at Fort Gordon, Georgia near his home in White Plains. He, along with his wife Virginia, have volunteered one afternoon each week in the CPFI office during the winter months for the last several years.

A message from
the President:



Every word of God proves true. He defends all who come to him for protection. Proverbs 30:5 (NLT) Francis Schaeffer said "we must both affirm the inerrancy of Scripture and live under it". This verse and thought resonated with me as I left the CPFI annual meeting. The truth of God's word was proclaimed in both worship sessions and educational programs. Our speakers were examples of those who both believed and then lived by those beliefs.

What makes this meeting different from all other spiritual and professional meetings I attend is that it focuses on living spiritually as a Christian pharmacist. Being around other pharmacists who walk the same path I am walking; learning that my problems are not unique to me; getting ideas to help me both professionally and spiritually, are some of the reasons that make this meeting different. Add to that a beautiful setting and warm fellowship and you have the ingredients of a great experience. Now the challenge is to apply what I heard to my daily living. Let's think about how to do that because that reality applies to all of us.

Successful pharmacists need to be both competent (I know what I need to know) as well as confident (I know I can use what I know). Schaeffer suggested that "we must affirm the inerrancy of scripture". Although this may be an over simplification, that could be the confidence part where I come to

realize that God is really who He said He was. For Job this level of confidence came after his dialogue with God when he came to the point when he could say "I had only heard about you before, but now I have seen you with my own eyes". Job 42:5 (NLT). For many of us it takes a period of time before we can finally say with complete confidence that God is all I need.

Schaeffer also said that we must live like we believe the scriptures (live under it). For me that means we must be competent in our knowledge of what God teaches in His word. That too is a life time effort. To become a pharmacist we have a course of study that we must master and then we have a lifetime of continual learning to remain competent as a pharmacist. Should we expect any less effort on our part to become competent in understanding how God wants us to live? I think not. Paul gave Timothy this advice; "Work hard so you can present yourself to God and receive his approval. Be a good worker, one who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly explains the word of truth". 2 Timothy 2:15 (NLT).

That is my challenge to you whether you did or did not attend the CPFI Annual Meeting. Get to really know God, not just know about Him, so you can become confident that His way is the only way. You also need to know His teachings so spend regular time learning His word so you know how He expects you to live. Then live it with competence and confidence.


